



# MATCH POSTPONEMENTS

Rule 10C(1) Except by permission of the Management Committee all matches must be played on the dates originally fixed..... Clubs may mutually agree to bring forward a match with the consent of the Fixture Secretary.

(2) A club requiring the postponement of any fixture shall submit its request in writing so as to reach the (Fixture) Secretary not less than fourteen days before the proposed date on which the match was scheduled to be played for consideration by the Management Committee.

Rule 10F Home and away matches shall be played. In the event of a Club failing to keep its engagement the Management Committee shall have power to inflict a fine, deduct points from the offending club, award the points to the opponents, order the defaulting club to pay any expenses incurred by the opponents or otherwise deal with them except the award of goals.

In the event of a scheduled fixture being postponed less than fourteen days prior each club must complete and send to the Fixture Secretary within three days a Postponement Form giving details of the reasons for the postponement.

The home club **MUST** notify the Results Secretary of any game postponed because of weather or pitch conditions. Similarly, if the game did not take place through no fault of either club. Clubs will be advised if further details are required in writing or if the phone call is sufficient.
